

What St Cuthbert (Out) Parish Council does in your area

The Council works on and supports environmental initiatives throughout the parish.

In the North Ward Cllr Newington is involved with the development of tree planting in the Jubilee Playing Field and the Asset Management Group is considering options for the Wookey Hole Triangle.

In the South Ward, as members of the Dulcote Recreation Ground Trust, we are consulting with the community for ideas. In the **East Ward** Cllr Humphreys has been seeking residents' views and hopes to trial a Dark Skies area.

In the **West Ward** Council is preparing to build a bridge over the leat to ease access to Coxley Recreation Ground. In the future, hopefully, another bridge will be built across the Sheppey to facilitate the Wells/Glastonbury multi-user path and access to the new hub, (Coxley Holt).

Affecting the whole Parish, the Council is participating in the preparations that The Strawberry Line Association, Greenways and Mendip District Council are working on to finalise the multi-user path that will complete the Bristol / Bath / Mendip / Weston circular, as well as creating a new path link between Wells and Glastonbury. Our Right of Way Working Group is looking at maintenance of our footways as well as where new paths may be needed between living and school / work destinations.

We need to hear from YOU

The Council is happy to carry forward with environmental intiatives within its budget, but we need to hear from you whether we are meeting your needs and expectations. For example, the Wookey Hole Triangle Japanese Knotweed problem is almost resolved and we are at the point where we can fence off the last of it and begin to make the area useful to you as a community. We have had a number of ideas:

- · Community garden with beehives
- Tree planting.

What do you favour? Do you have other ideas?

We are keen to hear from you wherever you live. Do you have any ideas for increasing residents' use of Dulcote Recreation Ground? Do you have other ideas for Coxley? How about in the Horringtons?

Public Transport in St Cuthbert (Out)

Finally, the council has been looking for some time at the poor public transport system in Somerset. We want to work towards better connections both around the area and out of the area, most specifically to railway stations.

So we need to know whether this would be attractive to you and it would help us greatly if a large number of residents filled in the survey via the link below.

The Council feels we need a system that better serves our villages with an integrated map of bus services, which includes Mendip Community Transport, the 67 and taxi contacts for late night arrivals.
