Additional comment received 09 November 21 (Cllr R James, Ditcheat Parish Council)

I am writing to you from Ditcheat but this is an issue which I think might be of interest to your council. I am a councillor in this parish. I know there is currently no direct bus service from Wells.

I have been in touch with Tony Reese who is a local bus partnership representative for South Somerset. I am copying in your local rep.

The situation at the CC station has not improved - lots of disruption with building by the Emily estate. The Carpark is totally full most of the time now - even with an extra 30 spaces with the supposed bus stop allocated to two car spaces!

The truth is that this station is the only one for miles and is used by people from a wide area and is effectively a regional hub. If you cannot park you cannot use the station. So regular public provision is urgently needed.

Our local number 1 bus which is routed via the station is not realistically available to disabled people and by not actually stopping at the station is a danger to alighting /boarding passengers particularly heading north!

The use of the station will grow even more as Emily estate attracts people to that point too. There is also a public inquiry this week in CC on a proposal to build 200 more houses above the station

This issue needs to be urgently addressed so that more people can safely use this station other than the first car parkers that arrive and fill the area for the whole day. The taxi service is also abysmal.

This issue needs action- by local councils, the rail/station operators and bus companies.

I would welcome your ideas/support in taking this project forward. Climate change is the biggest issue we all face, this can be a small piece of the solution
