


From ASB to work of ART

Glastonbury

Street priority

Reports of inconsiderate parking/ obstructions in the Clockhouse View location of Street and surrounding roads. Local residents have raised concerns about in-considerate parking in these area's. The Civil Parking Enforcement Officers, are the lead agency for any on street parking matters. However, local NPT officers will also pay passing patrols in this area
